## Highlights of the Past Year and Looking Foward to the Future



Imost every week, I have a reason to visit the San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center. And each time I do, I walk away feeling very fortunate to be involved with the only San Francisco institution that provides such a valuable service to our city. It also makes me feel safe to know that the Trauma Center is here and ready the moment you or I might need it.

I walk through the halls and see patients who are both vulnerable and reflective of the diversity of our city, receiving top quality healthcare. Also in those halls, clinics, and meeting rooms are hospital administrators and health care providers; each working to resolve health care challenges and find solutions for all. Collectively this dynamic group of men and women are a daily reminder of The General's purpose: to serve those who need it the most and provide the best healthcare possible. The San Francisco General Hospital Foundation's mission is to help ensure that The General is able to meet that commitment.

This past year, San Francisco General Hospital Foundation met its performance benchmarks operationally and financially, and we expect to continue to do so in the years ahead as long as you continue to join us in this effort. Our success is in recognition of the outstanding work that is done every day at The General.

In 2007, we received over \$5 million in awards/grants from Foundations and Corporations for the work being done at the hospital. Some of the highlights were:

- ✔ AVON once again was a major donor to the AVON Breast Center providing over \$1M in support
- ✓ Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation made a special award to fund the 'Data in a Box' program or the expansion of the server capacity of the hospital giving over \$2 M in support
- ✓ Salesforce.com Foundation made a \$100,000 unrestricted gift after touring the hospital and learning about the Center for Vulnerable Populations
- ✓ Timbuk2 Designs donated \$20,000 in products to the Women's Breastfeeding Center
- ✔ William Gilmore Foundation awarded a \$15,000 grant to the Acute Care for Elders (ACE) Unit
- ✓ Mount Zion Health Funds awarded \$75,000 to the Cancer Awareness Resources and Education (CARE) Spanish and Cantonese programs
- ✓ Macy's gave \$10,000 to the Mobile Mammography Van

The Macy's gift was part of the nearly half million dollars raised by our Heroes & Hearts luncheon. This annual event provides financial support for The General and the Foundation and heightens the public's awareness of how important The General is to San Francisco and beyond.

I want to encourage each of you to continue to support the San Francisco General Hospital Foundation and allow us to fulfill our mission and ensure that The General continues to be one of the best public hospitals in the country. Unfortunately, The General is facing a number of challenges, including a constrained budget, growing patient base, and a mandate to re-build. These challenges require all of us to help.


Remember The General is an important asset to the City.

- ✓ Referral Center for the DPH and its affiliated partners and only referring hospital for "Healthy San Francisco"
- ✓ Provides clinical training for the University of California San Francisco Schools of Nursing, Pharmacy, Dentistry, and Medicine as will as 200 clinical nursing placements for students from California State University System, community colleges, private universities and colleges, and
- $\checkmark$  \$65 million of UCSF led research is performed at The General every year

I thank you deeply for your support, but I also want to challenge each of us to think about what else we can do to help the San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center in 2008. In order for The General to address the challenges placed before it, we must help it obtain the resources needed to maintain current levels of service and the development of new solutions. 


