For patients at ZSFG with mental and behavioral health needs, whole-person care means a continuum of care that extends beyond discharge. The Vocational Rehabilitation Program at ZSFG provides job readiness and training courses to individuals with chronic mental illness as they transition into a new phase of their lives. One such Department of Psychiatry Citywide Employment Program, Slice of Life Catering, plays an important role on campus, sharing culinary creations at special events and meetings, as well as at the coffee carts and food stands throughout the ZSFG campus.

After years of searching, Slice of Life opened its first commercial space this year, providing more space to grow the business while supporting the Hospital's former patients as they gain skills in the kitchen, learn from experienced professionals like ZSFG Head Chef Mike Sullivan, and prepare for a career in the service industry.




The Future of Philanthropy

AVON Celebrates 20 Years of Care

The AVON Comprehensive Breast Center at ZSFG celebrated an important milestone this month–20 years of providing equitable access to preventative breast cancer screening services.

A state-of-the-art facility filled with warm and caring staff, beautiful healing spaces, and the latest breast-imaging technology, the AVON Center showcases the Hospital's dedication to infusing equity into everyday health care.

During the celebration, guests had the opportunity to tour the Mammovan, which began providing mammography services throughout San Francisco in 2007 thanks to support from the Foundation. Through an extensive outreach program and strong partnerships, the van is on the move two to three days each week, providing up to 15 appointments per day at community centers and clinics across San Francisco.

From culturally and linguistically appropriate care teams to prevention services that extend beyond the Center's walls with the Mammovan, this team continues to alleviate the inequities inherent in preventative cancer screenings.
